Box EA-460, 1000 Metro Manila, Philippines (hereinafter referred to as "PSP") of the other part;

and

THE KOREAN SOCIETY FOR PARASITOLOGY AND TROPICAL MEDICINE, a society established under the laws of the Republic of Korea and having an address at The Korean Society for Parasitology and Tropical Medicine, Department of Medical Zoology, Kyung Hee University School of Medicine, 02447, Seoul, Republic of Korea (hereinafter referred to as "KSP") of the other part;

and

The VIETNAM SOCIETY FOR INFECTIOUS DISEASES, a society established under the laws of Vietnam and having an address at 9 Floor, National Hospital for Tropical Disease, Bau Hamlet, Kim Chung Commune, Dong Anh District, Hanoi, VIETNAM (hereinafter referred to as "VSID") of the other part.

IAAVP, ISP, IPDCA, IAMCP, MSPTM, SIDC, PSP, KSP, TSP, PTAT and VSID shall hereinafter be referred to singularly as the "Party" and jointly as "Parties".

WHEREAS:

- A. IAAVP is INDIAN ASSOCIATION FOR THE ADVANCEMENT OF VETERINARY PARASITOLOGY.
- B. ISP is THE INDIAN SOCIETY FOR PARASITOLOGY.
- C. IPDCA is INDONESIAN PARASITIC DISEASES CONTROL ASSOCIATION.
- D. IAMCP is THE INDONESIAN ASSOCIATION OF MEDICAL SPECIALIST IN CLINICAL PARASITOLOGY.
- E. MSPTM is MALAYSIAN SOCIETY OF PARASITOLOGY AND TROPICAL MEDICINE.
- F. SIDC is SARAWAK INFECTIOUS DISEASE CENTRE.
- G. PSP is THE PHILIPPINE SOCIETY OF PARASITOLOGY, INC.
- H. KSP is THE KOREAN SOCIETY FOR PARASITOLOGY AND TROPICAL MEDICINE
- I. TSP is TAIWAN SOCIETY OF PARASITOLOGY.
- J. PTAT is PARASITOLOGY AND TROPICAL MEDICINE ASSOCIATION OF THAILAND.
- K. VSID is VIETNAM SOCIETY FOR INFECTIOUS DISEASES.

The Parties are desirous of entering into this Memorandum of Understanding (hereinafter referred to as "MoU") to declare their respective intentions, to improve understanding between their respective societies and to establish a basis of mutually beneficial cooperation and

collaboration benefiting their members upon the terms contained herein.

HAVE REACHED AN UNDERSTANDING as follows:

1. SCOPE AND FIELDS OF ACADEMIC COOPERATIONS

- 1.1. The Parties hereby agree to implement, within the framework of the rules and regulations applicable in each of their societies and subject to availability of funds and resources, the following programs and activities, which may include, but are not limited to: -
 - (a) creating a joint member database that will be accessible to all Parties;
 - (b) offering increased value-add to their membership;
 - (c) establishing a platform for matching areas of expertise and research interests;
 - (d) improving communication between leadership, members, and partners;
 - (e) organizing key networking events;
 - (f) providing a platform for capacity building and training for students and researchers through exchange programs and special joint projects;
 - (g) preparing joint proposals and conducting research in areas of mutual interest;
 - (g) sharing experiences and research results, exchanging publications, reports and other academic materials and information; and
 - (h) sharing other activities and programs in areas of mutual interest, where such sharing shall result in benefit to all Parties.
- 1.2. For the purpose of implementing co-operation in respect of any areas stated in Clause 1.1, this MoU shall be superseded by a legally binding agreement subject to terms and conditions as mutually agreed upon by the Parties including clauses on "confidentiality", "suspension", "protection of intellectual property rights" and "settlement of dispute" as contained in **Annexure A** of this MoU. PROVIDED ALWAYS that the decision whether to initiate and/or implement any program or activity shall be at the sole discretion of each Party.
- 1.3. The Parties agree to designate a coordinator on behalf of each society, whose responsibility will be to supervise the execution of this MoU and to draw up a program or activity to be implemented under this MoU, setting out specific provisions concerning the exchange programs, budget requirements and details of funding. For this purpose, the coordinator for:

- (a) IAAVP is Prof. Dr. A. Sangaran;
- (b) ISP is Prof. Sukhbir Kaur;
 - (c) IPDCA is Dr. dr. Rita Kusriastuti;
 - (d) IAMCP is Prof. dr. Agnes Kurniawan;
 - (e) MSPTM is Assoc. Prof. Dr Lucas Low Van Lun;
 - (f) SIDC is Assoc Prof. Dr. Ivan Yap Kok Seng;
 - (g) PSP is Prof. Dr. Vachel Gay V. Paller;
 - (h) KSP is Prof. Hyun-Hee Kong;
 - (i) TSP is Prof. Dr. Chia-Kwung Fan and
 - (j) PTAT is Assoc. Prof. Dr. Waranya Wongwit.
 - (k) VSID is Dr. Pham Ngoc Thach

2. JOINT RESEARCH AND PUBLICATION

- 2.1. The Parties may carry out joint research, subject to terms and conditions agreed upon by the Parties, in related fields for their mutual benefit and to enhance their reputation in academia.
- 2.2. The Parties agree to share teaching resources, such as images to aid in the diagnosis of various diseases, lab procedures and background knowledge. This sharing platform will be promoted by each institute among their staff to increase engagement with the program.

3. FINANCIAL ARRANGEMENTS

- 3.1. This MoU shall not give rise to any financial obligation by one Party to the other.
- 3.2. The Parties acknowledge that, in the absence of any specific agreement in writing to the contrary, each Party will be responsible for its own costs and expenses in establishing and conducting programs and activities contemplated under this MoU, including, without limitation, its own costs and expenses in travel and accommodation.

4. EFFECT OF MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

This MoU serves only as a record of the Parties' intentions and does not constitute or create and is not intended to constitute or create obligations under domestic or international law and shall not give rise to any legal process and shall not be deemed to

constitute or create any legally binding or enforceable obligations, whether expressly or implicitly.

5. NO AGENCY

Nothing contained herein is to be construed so as to constitute a joint venture partnership or formal business organisation of any kind between the Parties or so to constitute either Party as the agent of the other.

6. ENTRY INTO EFFECT, DURATION, TERMINATION AND EXTENSION

- 6.1. This MoU shall take effect on and from the date of execution of this MoU and shall continue to be effective for a period of **five (5) years** and may be extended for such further period as may be agreed upon by the Parties in writing.
- 6.2. Notwithstanding Clause 6.1 above, this MoU may be terminated by either Party giving written notice to the other Party at least **six (6) months** prior to the proposed date of termination.
- 6.3. Notwithstanding Clause 6.2 above, any ongoing programs or activities shall be carried out according to the terms that have been agreed upon under this MoU or such other agreements until their satisfactory completion, unless otherwise agreed upon in writing by the Parties.

7. IMPLEMENTATION

The implementation of this MoU is subject to sufficient funding being procured as appropriate by each Party.

8. NOTICE

- 8.1. Every notice, request or any other communication required or permitted to be given pursuant to this MoU shall be in writing, in the English language and delivered by registered mail to the address or sent to the electronic mail address or facsimile number of IAAVP, ISP, IPDCA, IAMCP, PSP, MSPTM, SIDC, KSP, TSP, PTAT and VSID as the case may be, shown below or to such other address or electronic mail address or facsimile number as either Party may have notified the sender and shall, unless otherwise provided herein, be deemed to be duly given or made when delivered to the recipient at such address or electronic mail address or facsimile number which is duly acknowledged:

ANNEXURE A

A. PROTECTION OF INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS

- 1. The protection of intellectual property rights shall be enforced in conformity with the respective national laws, rules and regulations of the Parties and with other international agreements signed by the Parties.
- 2. The use of the name, logo and/or official emblem of any of the Parties in any publication, document and/or paper is prohibited without the prior written approval of either Party.
- 3. Notwithstanding anything in paragraph 1 above, the intellectual property rights in respect of any technological development, and any products and services development, carried out:
 - (i) jointly by the Parties or research results obtained through the joint activity effort of the Parties, shall be jointly owned by the Parties in accordance with the terms to be mutually agreed upon; and
 - (ii) solely and separately by the Party or the research results obtained through the sole and separate effort of the Party, shall be solely owned by the Party concerned.

B. <u>CONFIDENTIALITY</u>

- 1. Each Party shall undertake to observe the confidentiality and secrecy of documents, information and other data received from or supplied to, the other Party during the period of the implementation of this Memorandum of Understanding or any other agreements made pursuant to this Memorandum of Understanding.
- 2. For purposes of paragraph 1 above, such documents, information and data include any document, information and data which is disclosed by a Party (the Disclosing Party) to the other Party (the Receiving Party) prior to, or after, the execution of this Memorandum of Understanding, involving technical, business, marketing, policy, know-how, planning, project management and other documents, information, data and/or solutions in any form, including but not limited to any document, information or data which is designated in writing to be confidential or by its nature intended to be for the knowledge of the Receiving Party or if orally given, is given in the circumstances of confidence.
- 3. The Parties agree that the provisions of this Article shall continue to be binding between the Parties notwithstanding the termination of this Memorandum of Understanding.

C. <u>SUSPENSION</u>

Each Party reserves the right for reasons of national security, national interest, public order or public health to suspend temporarily, either in whole or in part, the implementation of this Memorandum of Understanding which suspension shall take effect immediately after notification has been given to the other Party through diplomatic channels.

D. SETTLEMENT OF DISPUTES

Any difference or dispute between the Parties concerning the interpretation and/or implementation and/or application of any of the provisions of this Memorandum of Understanding shall be settled amicably through mutual consultation and/or negotiations between the Parties through diplomatic channels, without reference to any third party or international tribunal.
